

The focus this year was on support of refugees and migrants, specifically through Sisterworks. As a community, we are super proud to be supporting this amazing local agency,. As well as raising much needed funds for them, a number of our parishioners are volunteering their time, energy, and expertise to support women newly arrived in this country. As Luz said in her presentation, they (and therefore we) are all about “Sharing hope and creating dreams...”

Luz (Founder), Jordie (Operations manager), Vanessa (Entrepreneur) and Ifrin (Volunteer) shared a wonderful evening with the welcoming parishioners of St Martin’s and Christ Church. Fr. Richard prayed a heartfelt grace praying for the well-being of all people seeking asylum and refugees. We enjoyed a delicious dinner, and then turned the floor over to Luz. She inspired us with the 'SisterWorks Journey' talk, and had everyone inspired by it



As Luz says, “the partnership between SisterWorks and St Martin’s Hawksburn strengthens both communities and enriches our organisation, and we are most thankful for a wonderful evening.” (Luz even got to try a traditional Aussie trifle for the first time! Her verdict?? Delicious!! Thanks to everyone who set up, cleaned up, and provided food on the night.

An enormous thanks, also, to all who put so much time and effort into our raffle, which was also drawn that night. All of the prizes went to people outside of the parish, with first and third prize tickets being sold in and around the Hawksburn shops. To everyone, from those who donated prizes, who volunteered to sell tickets in the community, to those who bought **many** tickets themselves – thank-you. We have raised around \$19K for our mission and outreach efforts in the future.

***Affirmation of faith*** – introduced by the Service Assistant @10am

Let us together stand and affirm our faith

**We believe in one God,  
the Father, the almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father;  
through him all things were made.**

**For us and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven,  
was incarnate of the Holy Spirit  
and the virgin Mary  
and became truly human.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge  
the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son  
is worshipped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the  
forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread;  
and when he had given you thanks  
he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,  
'Take, eat. This is my body given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper, he took the cup,  
and again giving thanks  
he gave it to his disciples, saying,  
'Drink from this, all of you.

This is my blood of the new covenant  
shed for you and for many

for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

(Let us proclaim the mystery of faith.)

**Christ has died.**

**Christ is risen.**

**Christ will come again.**

Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded:

proclaiming his offering of himself  
made once for all upon the cross,  
his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,  
and looking for his coming again,  
we celebrate, with this bread and this cup,  
his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice  
for the sins of the whole world.

Renew us by your Holy Spirit  
unite us in the body of your Son,  
and bring us with all your people  
into the joy of your eternal kingdom;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord,  
with whom, and in whom,  
in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit,  
we worship you, Father,  
in songs of never-ending praise:

**Blessing and honour, glory and power,  
are yours for ever and ever, Amen.**

*The Celebrant breaks the bread while saying the following:*

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.  
We who are many are one body:  
**for we all share in the one bread.**

*The congregation says the Agnus Dei.*

**Jesus, lamb of God, have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us your peace.**

*The Celebrant invites the people to communion*

The gifts of God for the people of God. Come.

*All present are welcome to come and receive the communion. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please leave your hands at your side when you are offered the bread. After you have received communion, you may wish to proceed to the side chapel and light a candle as a sign of a special prayer for yourself or a loved one.*

Let us pray.

Gracious God,  
we thank you that in this sacrament  
you assure us of your goodness and love.  
Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving  
and help us to grow in love and obedience  
that we may serve you in the world  
and finally be brought to that table  
where all your saints feast with you for ever.

Father,  
**we offer ourselves to you  
as a living sacrifice  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.  
Send us out in the power of your Spirit  
to live and work to your praise and glory.**
